SCOPE OF ARTICLES

Articles of any length containing important scientific data concerning any aspect of the study of African Lepidoptera will be considered for publication. The content of such articles may include but will not be limited to:

1. Taxonomic reviews, systematics and descriptions of new taxa.
2. Life history descriptions, behavioural studies and ecological research including habitat descriptions.
3. Description of the lepidopteran fauna of specific areas, with checklists, photographs and notes.
4. Conservation management including IUCN assessments.
5. Phylogenetic hypotheses based on molecular analyses and other characters.
6. Lepidoptera atlasing and distribution.
7. Biogeographical analysis.
8. Methodologies applied to studies of Lepidoptera.

LENGTH OF ARTICLES

There is in principle no limitation to the length of articles. "Notes" will comprise articles of three pages or less. "Book Reviews" will normally be less than two pages.
